4c Literature

8 NSC Inventory Taking

In August 2023 the NSC decided that it will take its inventory annually.

The first cycle started in June 2024. At that meeting several possible formats were considered. It was decided to use the **CoDA Guidelines For Following The Twelve Traditions In Service Work** (others were not well suited to committee inventory).

The second full inventory cycle against this format was completed 1st August. Attendance has been as follows. Several meetings were abandoned and rescheduled due to low attendance – it was later decided to proceed with a minimum of 5 present:

2024 June – decision on format; Traditions 1-3	11

A suggestion has been made to take the NSC's inventory against the Service Concepts next time. In 2024, Voting Entity Liaison told the NSC that no such questionnaire exists, but sent an example of another committee's inventory format which contained some references to the Concepts. VEL: said that service committees are free to write their own formats/questionnaires and encouraged us to do so. A draft is in progress.

The next NSC inventory meeting is November 7th. As in June 2024, the meeting will start with discussion and voting on what approach to take next.

1. Proposal for NSC consideration

That the NSC recognises [**Service**] **Network** as a term describing an ongoing, collaborative form of CoDA service.

A Service Network is a group of CoDA members who voluntarily come together to support a continuing area of service through shared participation, experience, skills, and availability. Service Networks are distinct from officer roles, committees, and temporary workgroups.

The NSC further recognises the **Public Information Network** as a Service Network supporting Public Information service on behalf of CoDA UK.

2. Supporting background information

Over recent years, Public Information service has naturally developed as a collaborative network of members rather than the work of a single trusted servant.

Members contribute in many ways according to their skills, interests, and availability. This includes developing Public Information materials, attending community events, supporting new meetings, maintaining online resources, and building relationships with recovery professionals.

This way of serving differs from a temporary workgroup, which exists to complete a specific task, and from a committee, which usually has defined membership and delegated governance responsibilities.

A Service Network provides an ongoing way for members to participate in a continuing area of service while remaining accountable through the trusted servant and service body responsible for that area.

Recognising the term **Service Network** gives language to a form of service that already exists within CoDA UK and encourages wider participation without creating additional governance structures.

3. Is a vote required? Yes.

Recognition of the term **Service Network** and recognition of the Public Information Network as a Service Network.

4. Tradition Seven – requirements

No additional funding is requested.

The Public Information Network will continue to operate within budgets approved by the NSC.
